Three law makers visit Israel

Secretaries general of the three ruling parties hold a five day visit to Israel and Palestine to encourage peace in the region.

During their visit, they had talks with Israeli prime minister foreign minister and president and with PLO's leader urging the sides to engage in dialogue. The three had delivered personal letters to the leaders of both sides from PM Koizumi and visited UN base at the Golan Heights.

Kinden, Israeli firm form joint venture in network devices

Israel mulls canceling special duty on Korean cars

The duty does not apply to cars made in the EU and US.

Ministry of Industry and Trade and the Ministry of Finance Customs and VAT division are studying the possible ramifications of reducing or canceling the special 7% duty on cars imported from countries without bilateral trade agreements with Israel. The duty mainly affects **Japanese and Korean cars**. The special duty is not applied to cars made in the EU and US, with whom Israel has bilateral trade agreements generate pressure to cancel the duty on Japanese cars as well.

Officers of Scitex, Triangle Technologies, Israel Seed sued over management of Printlife.com.

Startup Printlife.com, which is operating under receivership, filed an NIS 32 million lawsuit against former officers at the company. These officers include Aryeh Rosenfeld, a managing partner at the **Dor Ventures** fund and former chief executive of Scitex; **Dr. Dan Isenberg** and the company he runs, **Triangle Technologies**; and **Michael Eisenberg of Israel Seed**. The three represented companies and funds that had shares in Printlife.

Hitachi's first VC investment in Israel: Icognito

Hitachi CVC Fund, the Japanese conglomerate's corporate venture capital fund, led a financing round for startup Icognito, its first investment in Israel. Hitachi invested \$1.6 million in the startup, which develops intelligent content recognition software. Existing investors also participated. This first round is meant to bring Icognito \$3.5 million, its chief executive Guy Rubinstein told TheMarker. Closure is expected in a few months.

Data sharing company Corigin about to complete \$5m 1st round.

Hitachi Data Systems will distribute Corigin's products in Britain under an agreement estimated at several million dollars.

Israel start-up Corigin, which specializes in data sharing solutions, is in the advanced stages of a \$5 million financing round, Corigin VP sales Ami Zuaretz said., Zuaretz said his company was in advanced negotiations with a number of Israeli funds and US investors. He also noted the company was negotiating with eight British companies to install its system. Corigin recently signed a distribution agreement with **Hitachi Data Systems** of **Britain**, under which Hitachi will distribute Corigin's solutions to its customers as an addition to its own storage management product line.

Vertex to represent Hitachi for investment in Israel.

Hitachi has appointed **Vertex Management Israel** as its investment representative in Israel. Vertex partner David Heller will manage Hitachi's investments in Israel. Hitachi will invest an estimated \$6-11million a year in Israeli start-ups, and might invest more if opportunities arise. Hitachi is an investor in Vertex, and has invested an estimated \$12 million in Israeli companies to date. Vertex will carry out due diligence and accompany the investment process for Hitachi.

Mitsubishi home networking chip to contain Itran transceiver.

The M306S chip will allow consumers to manage their home appliances via the Internet.

Mitsubishi Electric announced it was developing a single-chip power line communication integrated circuit for home networking, in cooperation with Beer Sheva-based Itran Communications and Microsoft. The chip will allow consumers to manage home appliances via the Internet, Mitsubishi says.

November

Israeli trade attach? in Tokyo: Israel, Japan negotiating free trade agreement.

Israel has opened negotiations on a free trade agreement with Japan, implied Minister Economic Affairs in Tokyo **Noah Shani** and **Professor Matsui**, a jurist involved in the negotiations. They were speaking at a "Club Japan" evening recently hosted by the Israel-Japan Chamber of Commerce.

Edusoft to distribute English learning systems in Japan

Japanese company **SQ Marketing**, a subsidiary of **Seiko Electric Corporation**, has acquired the Japanese distribution rights to Edusoft's English Discoveries Online (EDO) system. The system makes it possible to learn English on either the Internet or on an enterprise's Intranet network. The deal is worth an estimated at NIS 6 million (ABOUT \$1.3 MILLIONS) over the next two years. SQ Marketing provides computerized training solutions.

January-September exports to Far East down 23%

The Israel Export Institute reports that exports to the Far East, **excluding diamonds**, declined 23.5% to \$1.7 billion in the first nine months of 2002, compared with the corresponding period last year.

MagInk signs agreement worth over \$10m with Mitsubishi

MagInk, formerly e-Magin, develops electronic ink for billboards.

Japanese company Kirin Brewery, together with partners Yissum, the Research Development Company of the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, Hadasit, the Research Development Company of Hadassah University Hospital, and Algen Biopharmaceuticals, announced a new joint research venture on the use of Tyrphostin compounds for inhibiting certain components of the immune system involved in tissue or graft rejection.

Dmatek buys Mitsubishi's alcohol monitoring product line.

Electronic monitoring company Dmatek announced it bought the MEMS-2000 alcohol monitoring product line from Mitsubishi Electric & Electronic USA Inc. The value of the deal was not disclosed. Dmatek says it is acquiring from Mitsubishi all of the proprietary information related to the design of the product, including copyrights, trade secrets, licenses, intellectual property, and title. The agreement will enable Dmatek subsidiary Elmo-Tech to manufacture the Mems-2000 product, integrate it with other monitoring products and offer new versions.

Gottex enters Japanese market.

Local company to distribute \$ 1.0 million worth of Gottex bathing suits.

Gottex has signed an exclusive distribution agreement with Japanese company **Miulan** to distribute \$.1.0 million worth of Gottex products. Gottex bathing suits will be distributed in leading Japanese retail chains such as **Takashimaya**, **Mitsukoshi**, **Seibu** and **Isetan**. Gottex will begin supplying products to Japan in March 2003.

XMPie sells \$2m worth of products to Fuji Xerox.

XMPie develops and markets software solutions for direct personalized marketing.

Israeli start-up XMPie announced it has signed a distribution agreement with **Sakata Inx**, one of Japan's largest providers of graphics and printing technologies and products. XMPie develops and markets software solutions for direct personalized marketing.
